Living with the Dukha of Mongolia – a presentation by Andrew Bayly, MP for Port Waikato. In December 2022/January 2023, Andrew Bayly and his youngest son George spent over two weeks living and travelling with the Dukha people of northern Mongolia, one of the last groups of nomadic reindeer herders in the world.

They experienced the brutal conditions of midwinter and the harsh realities of the Dukha's everyday lives, but also shared their joy, kind-heartedness and generosity. Outside of his Parliamentary role, Andrew is an adventurer and mountain climber who has walked and dragged sledges to both Antarctic and Arctic poles. The trip to Mongolia is the third intrepid journey he has shared with each of his three sons as they have come of age.
