Trip Survey Results

Hi Members

Thank you to everyone who completed and returned a Trips Survey Form.


We thought you would be interested in what has come from the analysis and our learnings.

- Number of responses = 26
- 50% had taken part in a club trip in the last 12 months
- 50% had not taken part in a club trip
- 100% of responses show that members want Trips to continue as part of the club activities

Reasons for not taking part in a trip

As you can see in the chart below the top factor affecting trips participation was clashes with other life events.

Personal mobility issues & destinations not of interest were the next highest factors.



Comments

In the comments section we had a couple of themes coming through.

There was a clear preference for shorter trips that did not have an early start and late return to Pukekohe. This linked with an option to use carpooling for local trips.

There were lots of suggestions for destinations for future trips – both local & further afield. (Including those who still want to go to Sculptureum – one of our cancelled destinations)

There was also a view that the social dimension of the trip may be as important as the destination.

Learnings

The learnings for our Trips Sub-committee are :

- In the past we have typically planned trips on a Thursday. So to try to avoid clashes with other regular events we will aim to rotate the day of the week when trips are scheduled
- We will aim to include shorter / local trips in the trips plan and include car-pooling where appropriate
- For longer trips we will aim to co-ordinate with other local Probus clubs so that we can ensure there are enough attending to make hire of buses viable
- Lastly we will use your suggestions for future trip destinations to fill out the planned trips schedule

We hope that we do not have to cancel any future trips, if we work with these learnings in mind.
